Champions force extras with Quebec

Ottawa showed good fight by scoring four runs in the final two innings, but ultimately fell 8-6 to the Capitales in ten innings. Two hard-hit balls to third base in the bottom of the ninth from CF Chase Harris and SS Daniel Bick erased a three-point deficit. However, Quebec tagged Ottawa's RHP James Jones for two runs in the tenth, causing Jones to take his first loss of the season. 1B Vinny Guglietti and LF Brian Portelli each had RBIs while trying to claw Ottawa back into the game.

Champions among the league leaders

Several Champions find themselves ranking among the Can-Am League's best in certain statistical categories. **RHP Jordan Kurokawa** is first in both wins (11) and ERA (2.08). His ERA is a full 14 points better than the second-place hurler, and the Hawaiian is also fifth in punchouts with 78. **RHP Austin Chrismon** and Kurokawa are third and fourth, respectively, in innings pitched. **LHP Scott Maine** finds himself second in saves with 12. Offensively, **CF Chase Harris** is fourth in stolen bases (23). **DH Sebastien Boucher** is also having a good showing. Although he hasn't hit a home run, Boucher is third with 104 hits. The Gatineau, Que. native is also consistently top five in batting average and is on track to become the first Champion to hit over .300 in franchise history.

Scouting the Capitales

Quebec have settled comfortably into second place in the league thanks to their team ERA of 3.66 – the best on the circuit. Tremendous starting pitching performances from **LHP Jay Johnson** and **RHP Lazaro Blanco** have helped keep that ERA to a minimum. The Capitales bullpen has also been lights-out and is anchored by **RHP Trevor Bayless**. Offensively, the addition of **INF Zach Wilson** has paid dividends for the Capitales.

Champs sign Lee

The Champions have signed **LHP/DH Bill Lee** and placed him on the disabled list. The 72-year-old pitched in the major leagues for 14 seasons from 1969 to 1982. Lee will appear for the Champions in their game on Monday, September 3.

Sikula returns to Quebec

Approximately two months after leaving the Capitales to join the Mexican League, **RHP Arik Sikula** is back in Quebec. The righty didn't have much success with Saltillo, as he went 0-4 with a 7.31 ERA over seven appearances. The former Toronto Blue Jays farmhand will look to recapture the magic that saw him dominate the Can-Am League earlier this year. He has an 8-2 record as a member of the Capitales, with a 2.51 ERA. Sikula was second in the league in strikeouts and innings pitched when he left for Mexico.
